Director James K. Le Tellier,

For the month of March, while performing my duties as a Class I Special Law Enforcement Officer the following Residential Code Violations were observed during my routine patrols and/or checked on as a follow up to citizen complaints:

- **112 MONMOUTH STREET**
  - While driving around on patrol in the borough I observed a mattress located in the front yard of 112 Monmouth Street. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#406) requesting the owner to remove the mattress. On follow up, the mattress was removed and the violation corrected.
- **301 PARK AVENUE**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed a couch located in the front yard along the sidewalk of 301 Park Avenue. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#407) requesting the owner remove the couch from the front of the property. On follow up, the couch was removed from the property.
- **401 STOCKTON STREET**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed multiple items of furniture along Dutch Neck Road to the side of the property located at 401 Stockton Street. I spoke to the homeowner and subsequently issued a Notice of Violation (#408). On follow up, the furniture was all removed from the curb line.
- **407 NORTH MAIN STREET**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed a fallen tree to the rear of 407 North Main Street. I spoke to the resident who advised she has made multiple requests to the landlord to remove the tree. As a result of such, I issued a Notice of Violation (#409) requesting the owner of the property remove the tree. I received notice from the Construction Official the owner will be removing the tree, but will not be done within 5 days. Additional follow up pending.
- **503 NORTH MAIN STREET**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed a couch and other furniture items on the corner of the property located at 503 North Main Street. I spoke to the owner of the property

upon the initial incident, as well as issued a Notice of Violation (#410). On follow up, the items were all removed from the curb.

- **MONMOUTH STREET (BETWEEN HTS CRAN STA & NORTH MAIN)**
  - I received a complaint of garbage bags being piled up along Monmouth Street between Hightstown Cranbury Station Road and North Main Street from the Construction Official. After checking the area, the complaint was determined to be unfounded and no action was taken.
- **DUTCH NECK ROAD (AREA OF STOCKTON STREET)**
  - I received a complaint from the Construction Official of overgrown bushes impeding the roadway from the Construction Official. After checking the area, the bushes were not deemed to be impeding into the roadway and no action was taken.
- **228 / 226 NORTH MAIN STREET**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed a large amount of debris to the rear of the duplex located at 228/226 North Main Street. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#411/ #412) to both properties
- **14 GRAPE RUN ROAD**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed a damaged section of fence dividing the front and the rear portion of the property located at 14 Grape Run Road. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#413) and spoke to the owner of the residence. I advised the owner that the fence needed to be repaired and was in violation of Borough Code. On follow up, the fence was repaired.
- **225 MORRISON AVENUE, APT. #2**
  - While patrolling the borough I observed a mattress leaning against a tree in the front of the property. The home is a rental, and after speaking to a resident it was determined the mattress was put out by the resident of Apartment 2. Subsequently, a Notice of Violation (#414) was issued to the resident. Follow up pending.
- **144 FRANKLIN STREET**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed an obstruction in the line of sight for motorists turning from Cole Avenue onto Franklin Street due to high bushes in front of the residence located at 144 Franklin Street. Subsequently, a Notice of Violation (#415) was issued. Follow up pending.
- **305 MORRISON AVENUE**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed a large amount of debris in the rear left corner of the property located 305 Morrison Avenue. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#416) to the property owner. Follow up pending.
- **100 FIRST AVENUE**
  - While patrolling the borough, I observed a mattress in the side yard of the property located at 100 First Avenue. After performing a walkaround of the property, I also noticed a large amount of debris and junk along the left side of the home. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#417). Follow up pending.

- **156 SECOND AVENUE**

- While patrolling the borough, I observed an old TV in the front yard of the residence located at 156 Second Avenue. I had issued a Notice of Violation in the past and the TV was removed. The homeowner was outside, at which time I spoke to him and advised him the TV needed to be removed and permanently disposed of or a summons would be issued since a Notice of Violation was issued (October 2012) regarding the same. The homeowner verbally advised he would comply. Follow up pending.
