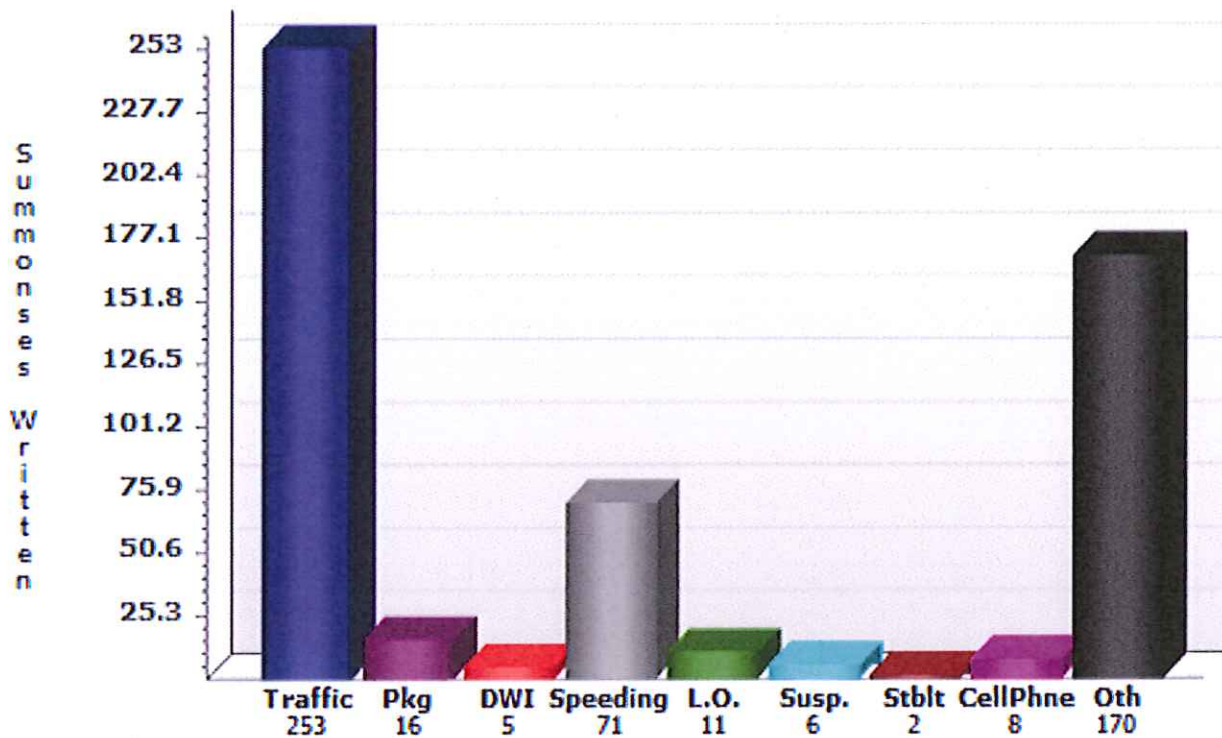

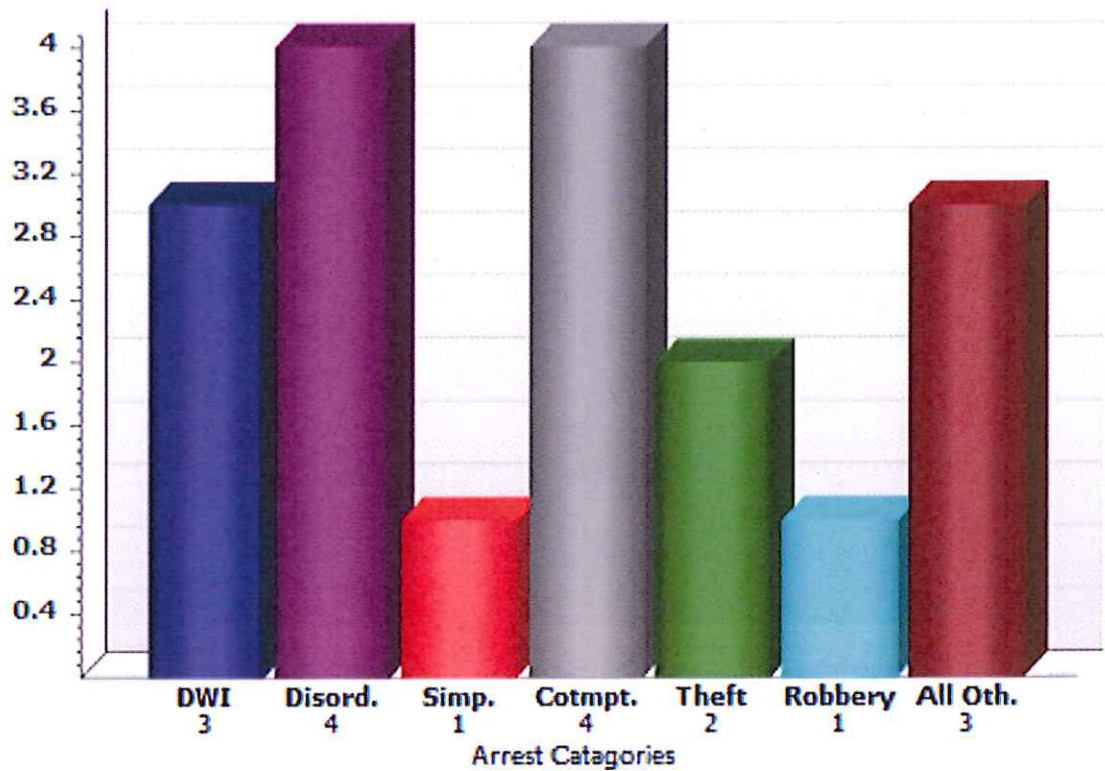
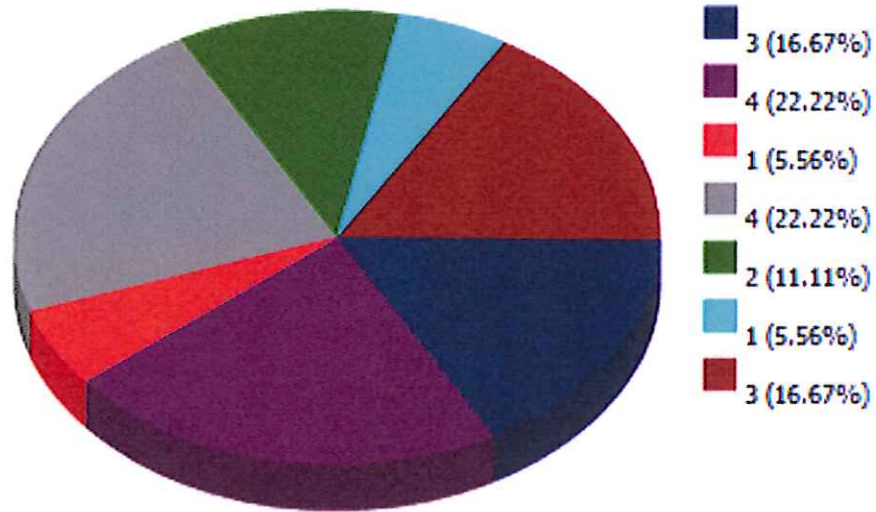

For the month of May, while performing my duties as a Class I Special Law Enforcement Officer the following Residential Code Violations were observed during my routine patrols and/or checked on as a follow up to citizen complaints:

## **NEW VIOLATIONS:**

- **152 SECOND AVENUE**
  - While on routine patrol in the Borough I observed the grass at the above listed property to be overgrown and not properly maintained as outlined in the Borough Code. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#430 – Police Incident #13-06328) to the Property Owner. Upon follow up, the violation was corrected within the allotted timeframe. No further action was taken as of this time.
- **254 STOCKTON STREET**
  - While on routine patrol in the Borough I observed the grass at the above listed property to be overgrown and not properly maintained as outlined in the Borough Code. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#431 – Police Incident #13-06682) to the Property Owner. Upon follow up, the violation was corrected within the allotted timeframe. No further action was taken as of this time.

- **119 SPRINGCREST DRIVE**


- On follow up, the homeowner placed Bulk Pick-Up Stickers on the items in the front of the residence, and the items were removed by Public Works. No further action taken at this time.
