



Monthly Summons Breakdown Report















For the month of May, while performing my duties as a Class I Special Law Enforcement Officer the following Residential Code Violations were observed during my routine patrols and/or checked on as a follow up to citizen complaints:

NEW VIOLATIONS:

152 SECOND AVENUE

While on routine patrol in the Borough I observed the grass at the above listed property to be overgrown and not properly maintained as outlined in the Borough Code. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#430 – Police Incident #13-06328) to the Property Owner. Upon follow up, the violation was corrected within the allotted timeframe. No further action was taken as of this time.

254 STOCKTON STREET

While on routine patrol in the Borough I observed the grass at the above listed property to be overgrown and not properly maintained as outlined in the Borough Code. Subsequently, I issued a Notice of Violation (#431 – Police Incident #13-06682 to the Property Owner. Upon follow up, the violation was corrected within the allotted timeframe. No further action was taken as of this time.
