For the month of June, while performing my duties as a Class I Special Law Enforcement Officer the following Residential Code Violations were observed during my routine patrols and/or checked on as a follow up to citizen complaints:

NEW VIOLATIONS:

- **106 CLINTON STREET**
 - A complaint was forwarded to the Construction Department regarding a large amount of logs as well as a hot dog cart in the driveway of 106 Clinton Street. Upon arrival the complaint was confirmed. I spoke to the homeowner, advised him of the complaint and issued Notice of Violation #447. Upon further follow up, the violation was corrected and no further action was taken.
- **50 CLOVER LANE**
 - A complaint was forwarded to the Construction Department regarding overgrown grass at 50 Clover Lane. Upon arrival, the complaint was unfounded. No further action taken at this time.
- **157 OAK LANE**
 - A complaint was forwarded to the Construction Department regarding overgrown grass at 157 Oak Lane. Upon arrival, the complaint was unfounded. No further action taken at this time.
- **321 PARK AVENUE**
 - A complaint was forwarded to the Construction Department of furniture and debris in front of various residences on Park Avenue. Upon arrival I located the homes the complainant was referencing at the time of the complaint. Notice of Violation #448 was issued for the homeowner to remove the debris from the curb. On further follow up, the items were removed from the curb and no further action was taken.
- **316 PARK AVENUE**
 - A complaint was forwarded to the Construction Department of furniture and debris in front of various residences on Park Avenue. Upon arrival I located the homes the complainant was referencing at the time of the complaint. Notice of Violation #449 was

issued for the homeowner to remove the debris from the curb. On further follow up, the items were removed from the curb and no further action was taken.

- **112 MANLOVE AVENUE**

- While on routine patrol in the Borough, I observed the front grass located at 112 Manlove Avenue to be overgrown and not kept in compliance with Borough Code. Notice of Violation #450 was issued on June 9th, 2013. On further follow up (June 20th, 2013) the homeowner had still not cut the grass at the property. Summons SC-1704 was issued for violation of Borough Code 14-5.5B to the homeowner listed with the Hightstown Borough Tax Department.

- **409 SUMMIT ST**

- A complaint was forwarded to the Construction Department of a fallen tree to the rear of 409 Summit Street. Upon arrival I checked the property and located the fallen tree between the home and the church to the right of the property. Notice of Violation #452 was issued advising the homeowner to remove the tree. Further follow up pending.

- **110 FIRST AVENUE**

- While on routine patrol in the Borough, I observed furniture to be thrown away in front of the home located at 110 First Avenue. Notice of Violation #451 was issued to the homeowner and bulk pick up tags were obtained. No further action taken.

- **228/230 FRANKLIN STREET**

- While on routine patrol in the Borough, I observed debris in front of the residence as well as overgrown grass in the front of the duplex located at 228/230 Franklin Street. Notice of Violation #453 was issued. Follow up pending.

- **254 STOCKTON STREET**

- A complaint was forwarded to the Construction Department regarding overgrown grass at the home located at 254 Stockton Street. Upon arrival, the complaint was confirmed. I spoke to the homeowner whom I have dealt with in the past. The homeowner advised me that she was going through a hardship and obtaining a landscaper was difficult. The homeowner was advised of the violation verbally and was given additional time to have the lawn maintained. On follow up, the violation was corrected. No further action.

- **204 MAXWELL AVENUE**

- While on routine patrol in the Borough, I observed a couch in the side yard of 204 Maxwell Avenue near Clinton Street. Notice of Violation #454 was issued to the homeowner advising them the couch needed to be removed from the curb and bulk pick up tags needed to be obtained. Further follow up pending.

- **215 NORTH MAIN STREET**

- While on routine patrol in the Borough, I observed the lawn of 215 North Main Street to not be maintained within the parameters of Borough Code. The homeowner was issued a Notice of Violation #455. Further follow up pending.

- **401 NORTH MAIN STREET**
 - A complaint was made with the Construction Department regarding a mattress located to the rear of 401 North Main Street. Upon arrival the complaint was confirmed and Notice of Violation #456.
- **133 WILLIAMS STREET**
 - A complaint was made with the Construction Department regarding a large amount of debris in the rear of 133 Williams Street. Upon arrival the complaint was confirmed and Notice of Violation #457 was issued to the homeowner. The homeowner advised me they would likely not be able to remove all of the debris within 5 days as the Notice of Violation requires. I advised the homeowner to maintain email contact with me and to advise me of the progress made if they were not able to remove all of the debris. Email contact was made by the homeowner advising they are looking into options for obtaining a storage shed to keep their belongings in, as well as sorting through the belongings and separating trash from items they want to keep. The homeowner advised the lot should be entirely cleaned up within a month. Further follow up pending
- **409 SOUTH MAIN STREET**
 - A complaint was made with the Construction Department regarding the residence located at 409 South Main Street concerning the overgrown shrubbery and vegetation near the sidewalk and front of the property. Upon arrival, the vegetation was overgrowing the sidewalk and was an obstruction to the line of sight for traffic stopped on Etra Road, awaiting turn onto South Main Street. Notice of Violation #458 was issued to the homeowner. Follow up pending.
- **50 CLOVER LANE**
 - An additional complaint was made to the Construction Department regarding 50 Clover Lane. The complaint was regarding excessive debris believed to be from the removal of a pool in the street by this address. On follow up, there was no violation present and no further action was taken at this time. I made contact with the homeowner to inquire about such and the homeowner advised that there was debris in front of the residence but he had obtained bulk pick up tags from the Hightstown Borough Department of Public Works to have the items removed. No further action taken.


FOLLOW-UP INSPECTIONS:

- **116 GILMAN PLACE**
 - Upon follow up at the residence the grass was cut and no additional violations were noticed. No further action was taken at the time of the follow up.
- **132 STOCKTON STREET**
 - On follow up at the residence, there was no progress made and the bulk items were still in the driveway. Summons #SC-1706 was issued for violation of Borough Code 14-5.2 for having debris on a residential property.

- **126 STOCKTON STREET**
 - On follow up at the residence, there was no progress made and the bulk items, refrigerator and construction debris were still in the side and back yard of the property. Summons #SC-1705 was issued for violation of Borough Code 14-5.2 for having debris on a residential property.
- **7 ROCKY BROOK COURT**
 - On follow up at this address, I spoke to the homeowner's daughter who advised that her mother would be in contact with me. The homeowner contacted me via email on 6/28/13 advising that she ordered a new garage door however the wrong size was shipped to the installer. The installer ordered a new door, and the delivery date is unknown.
- **110 MANLOVE AVENUE**
 - On follow up, the homeowner had cut the grass and no additional violations were observed at the residence. No further action taken.

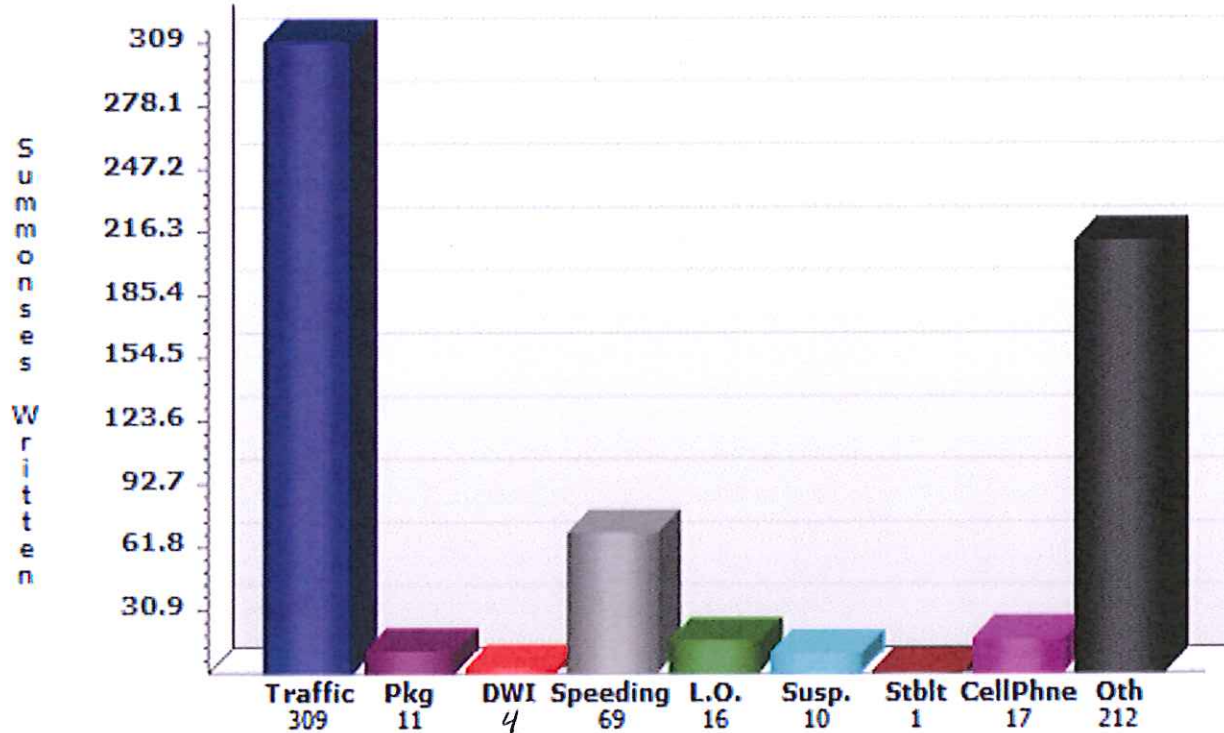
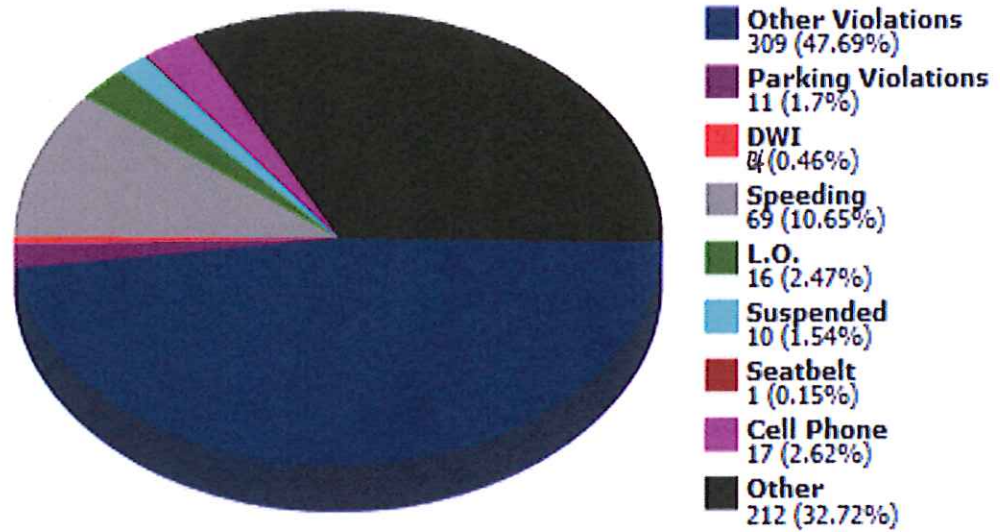
