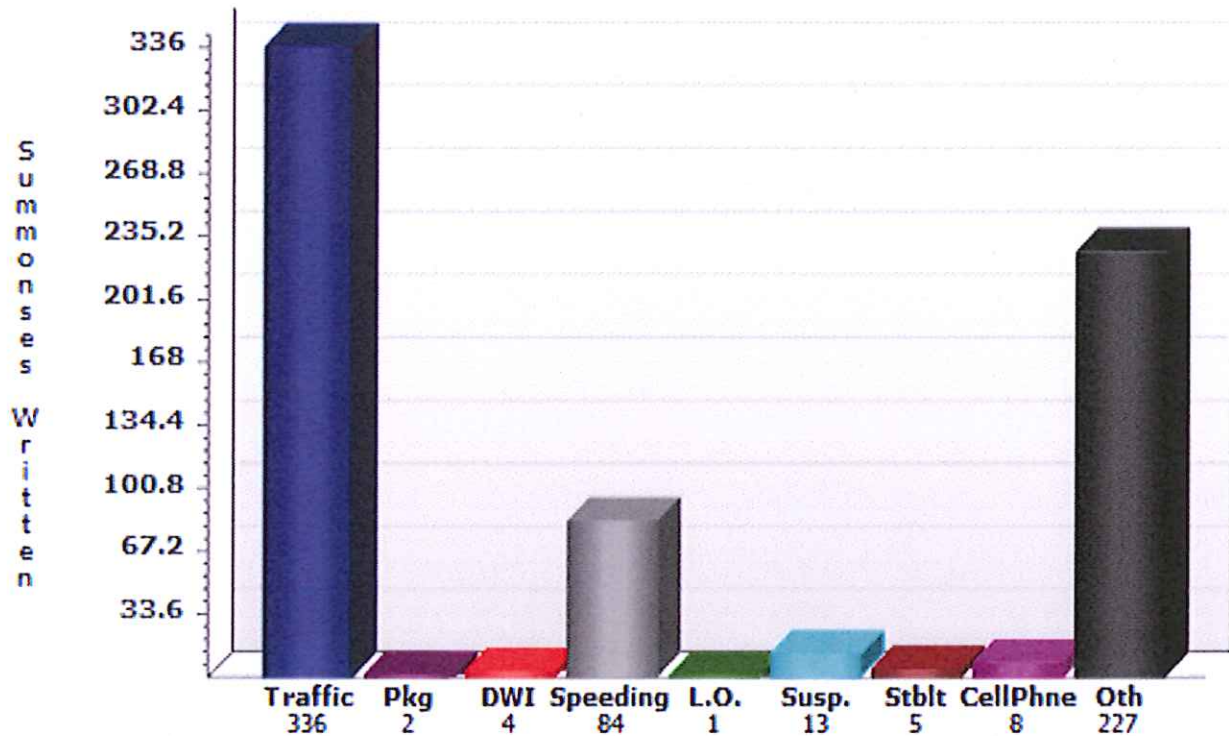
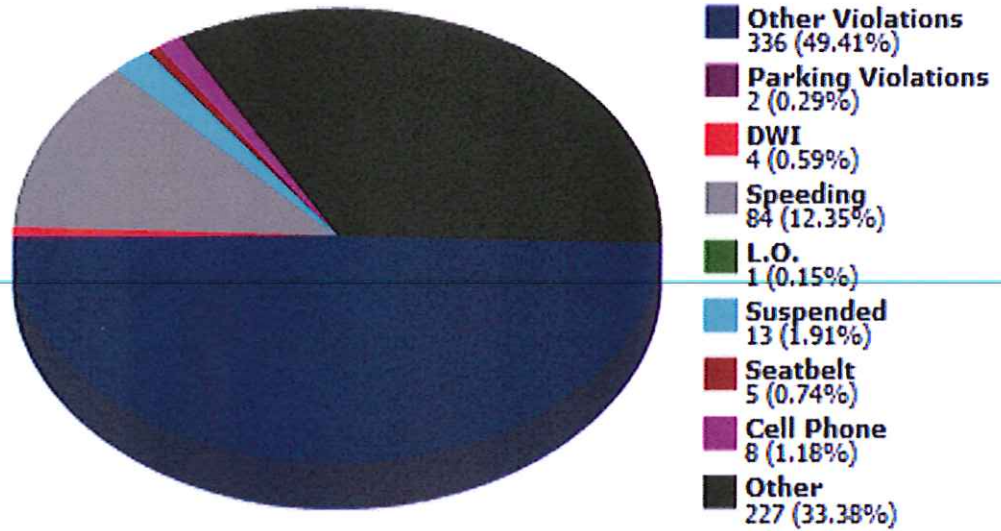

Summons Graphs for: September 2013



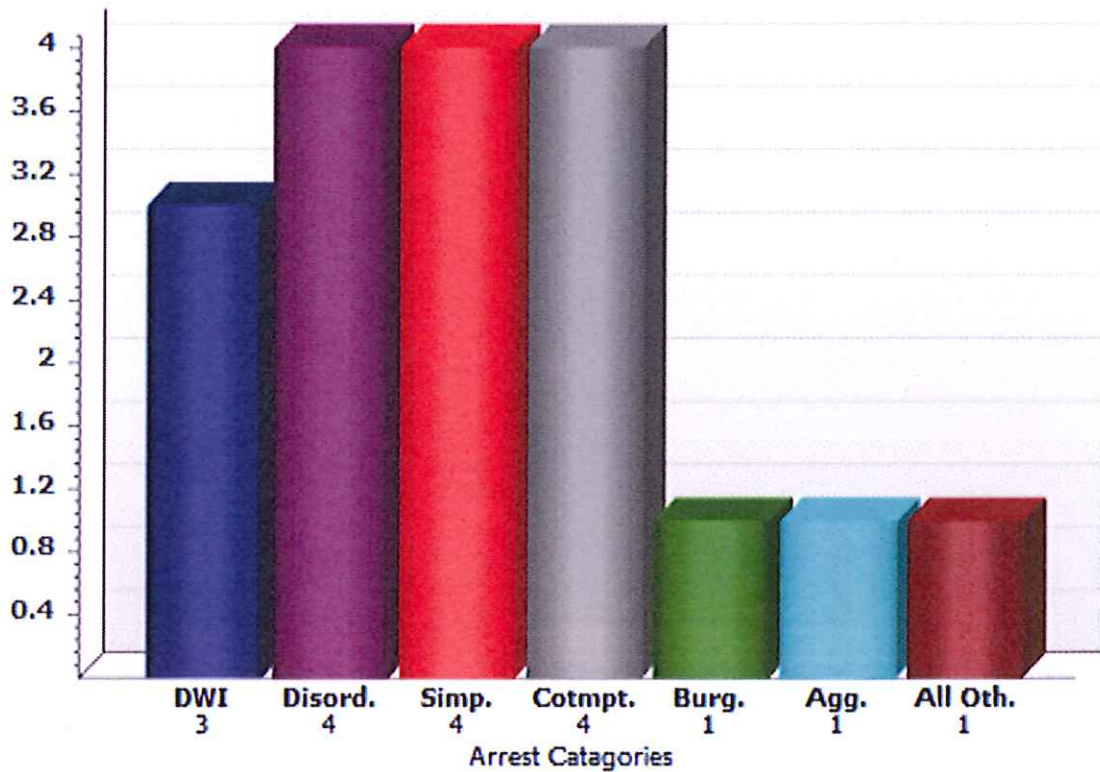
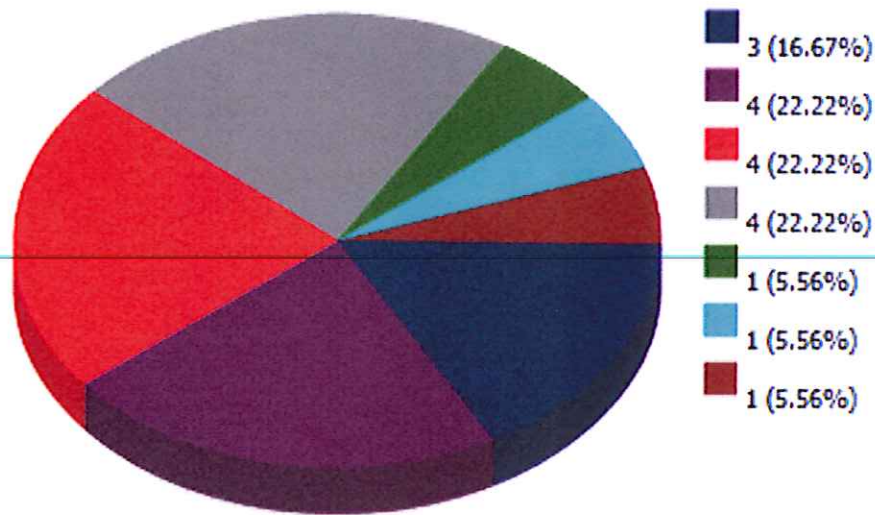

Arrest Graphs for: September 2013



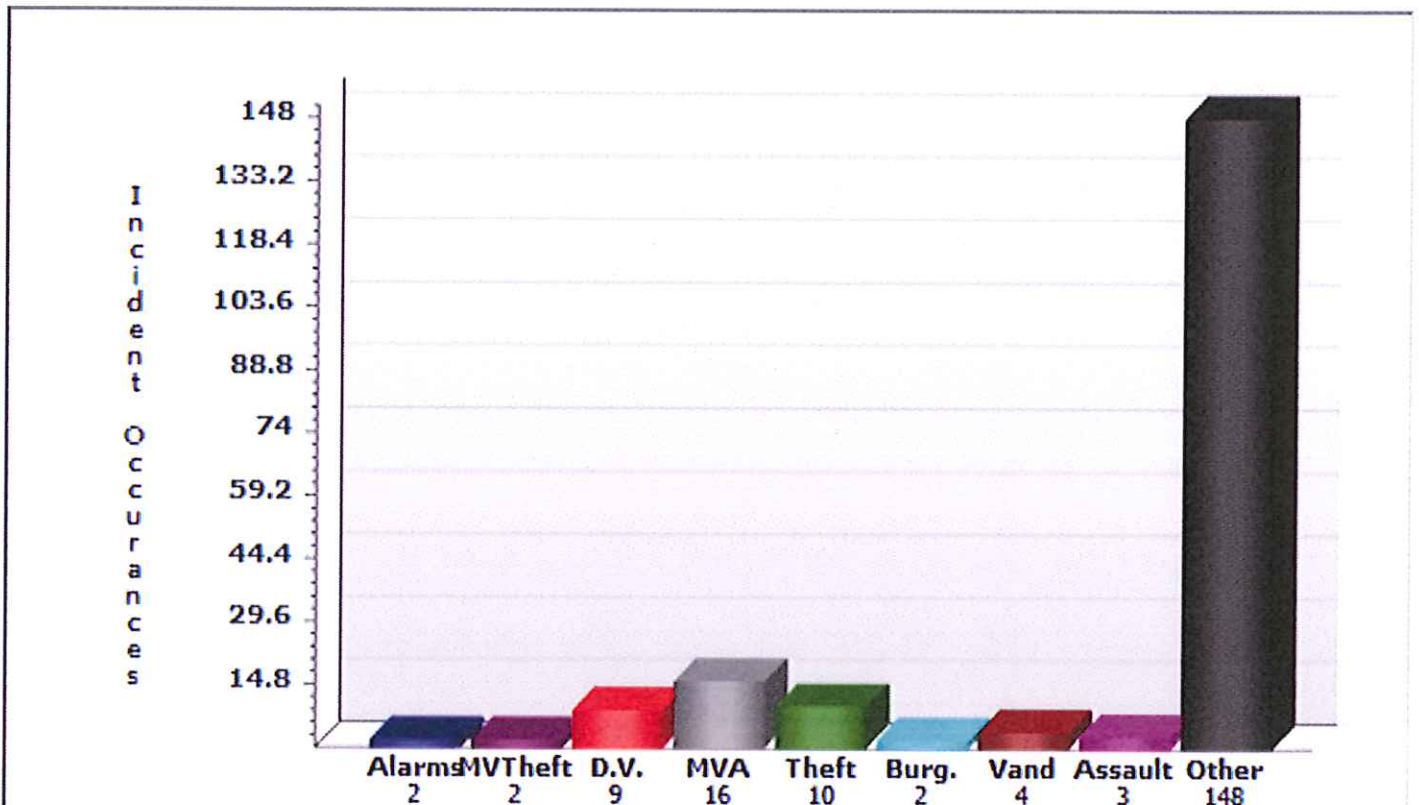
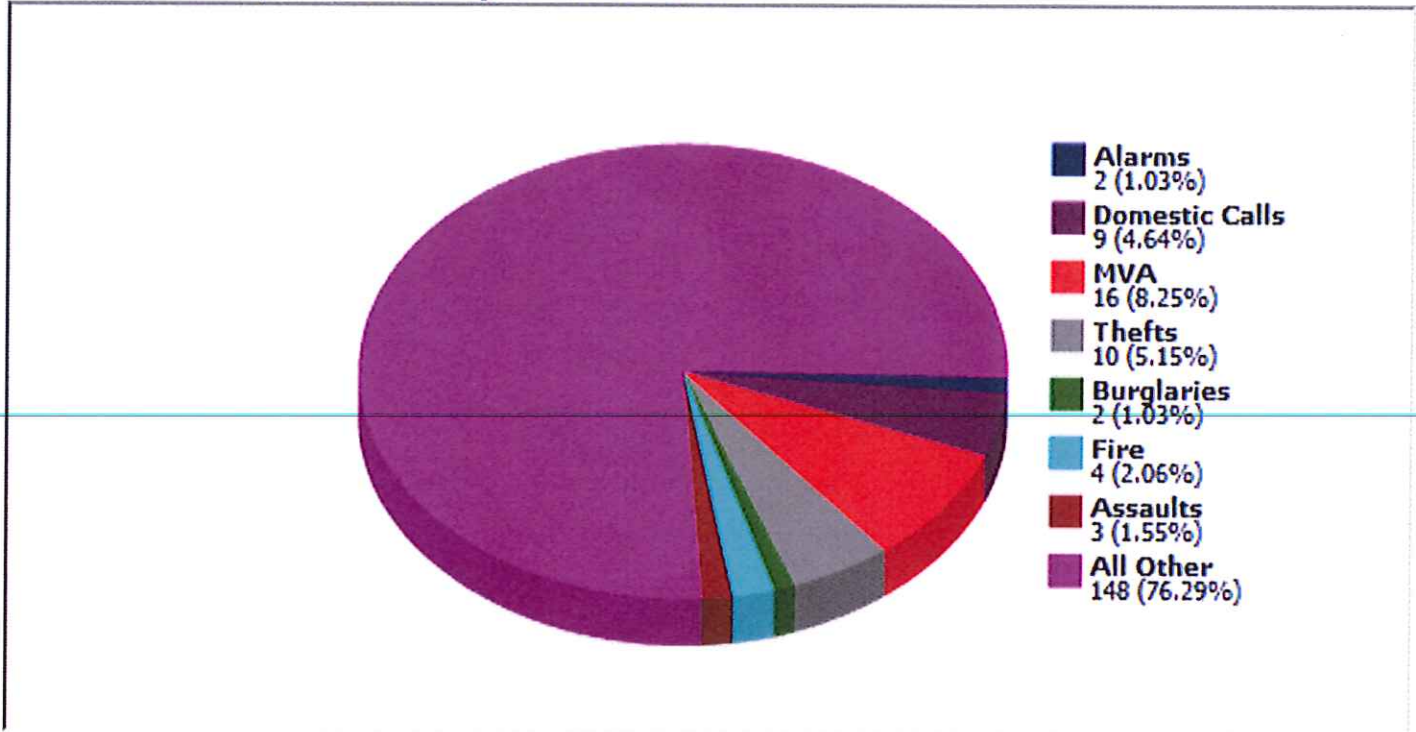

For the month of September 2013, while performing my duties as a Class I Special Law Enforcement Officer the following Borough Ordinance violations were observed during my patrols and/or checked on as follow up to citizen complaints:

52 MEADOW DRIVE
